



A Country Garden

Size 30" x 30"

Block size 9" x 9"

All fabrics are from Fabric Freedom

Requirements

1. Lilac and gold country garden F387 col. 3 - Fat 1/8
2. Gold floral texture F391 col. 5 - Fat 1/8
3. Lilac poppies F390 col. 3 - Fat 1/8
4. Lilac tonal country scene F338 col. 3 - Fat 1/8
5. Gold tonal country scene F388 col. 5 - Fat 1/8
6. Lilac and Gold anemones F392 col. 3 - Fat 1/8
7. Lilac flower pots F389 col. 3 - Long 1/4
8. Lilac and Gold daisies F393 col. 3 - Long 1/4
9. Green tonal country scene F388col. 4 - 40cm (3/8 yard)
10. Cream from Perfect Palette H50 col. 20 - 40cm (3/8 yard)

Wadding and backing - 34" x 34"

Thread Aurifil . 2510 light pink. 2125 cream/yellow. 2110 pale cream.

Cutting.

From fabric 1

5 x 3½" x 3½" squares

From fabric 2

6 x 4¼" x 4¼" squares cut in half diagonally twice

From fabric 3

9 x 4¼" x 4¼" squares cut in half diagonally twice

From fabric 4

10 x 2" x 2" squares
10 x 2" x 3½" strips

From fabric 5

10 x 2" x 2" squares
10 x 2" x 3½" strips

From fabric 6

8 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" squares cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 7

40 x 2" x 2" squares

From fabric 8

40 x 2" x 2" squares

From fabric 9

3 x 4¼" x 4¼" squares cut in half diagonally twice
4 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" squares cut in half diagonally once
4 x 2⅜" x 2⅜" squares cut in half diagonally once (one is use for the border)
1 x 2" x 27½" strip for border
1 x 2" x 29" strip for border

From fabric 10

3 x 4½" x 4½" squares cut in half diagonally twice
4 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" squares cut in half diagonally once
4 x 2⅜" x 2⅜" squares cut in half diagonally once (one is use for the border)
1 x 2" x 27½" strip for border
1 x 2" x 29" strip for border

Block 1

You will make 5 of block one in total. The quilt is split diagonally, the top left of the quilt uses fabric 10 for the background, and the bottom right uses fabric 9 for the background fabric.

For one block you will use fabrics 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 10.

For three blocks you will use fabrics 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and on one half you will use fabric 9 and then 10 on the other.

For one block you will use fabrics 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 9

Block 2

For two blocks you will use fabrics 6, 7, 8 and 10

For two blocks you will use fabrics 6, 7, 8 and 9

Making up

For block 1

Lay out all your fabric pieces as in *diagram 1*, taking care to use the right fabric for each block. Start with the block using only fabric 10 for the background pieces.

Sew the triangles together in pairs to form larger triangles, pressing as you go. Then sew the triangles together to make squares.

Next sew your two small squares together in pairs and press, add a strip to each pair to make the corner squares.

Lay out all of the pieces and join them together in rows of three and press. Next sew the rows together to make the block. Press.

When making the 3 middle blocks you will use two background fabrics, one colour will be on one side and the other colour on the other side. The last one you will use is fabric 9. Make 5 blocks in total.

For Block 2

Lay out all your fabric pieces as in *diagram 2*. With this block you will have two blocks with the fabric 9 as background and with the other two you will use fabric 10.

Sew your triangles together in pairs to make squares. Now sew your small squares together into pairs and join the pairs together to form larger squares. Remember to press as you go.

Lay out your sewn pieces and join them together in rows of three, then sew the rows together to form the block. Press

Make 4 blocks in total.

Now lay out your blocks as in the *main diagram*. Join the blocks together to make rows and then sew the rows together.

Making up the border.

Start by making up the small squares for the two corners using fabrics 9 and 10.

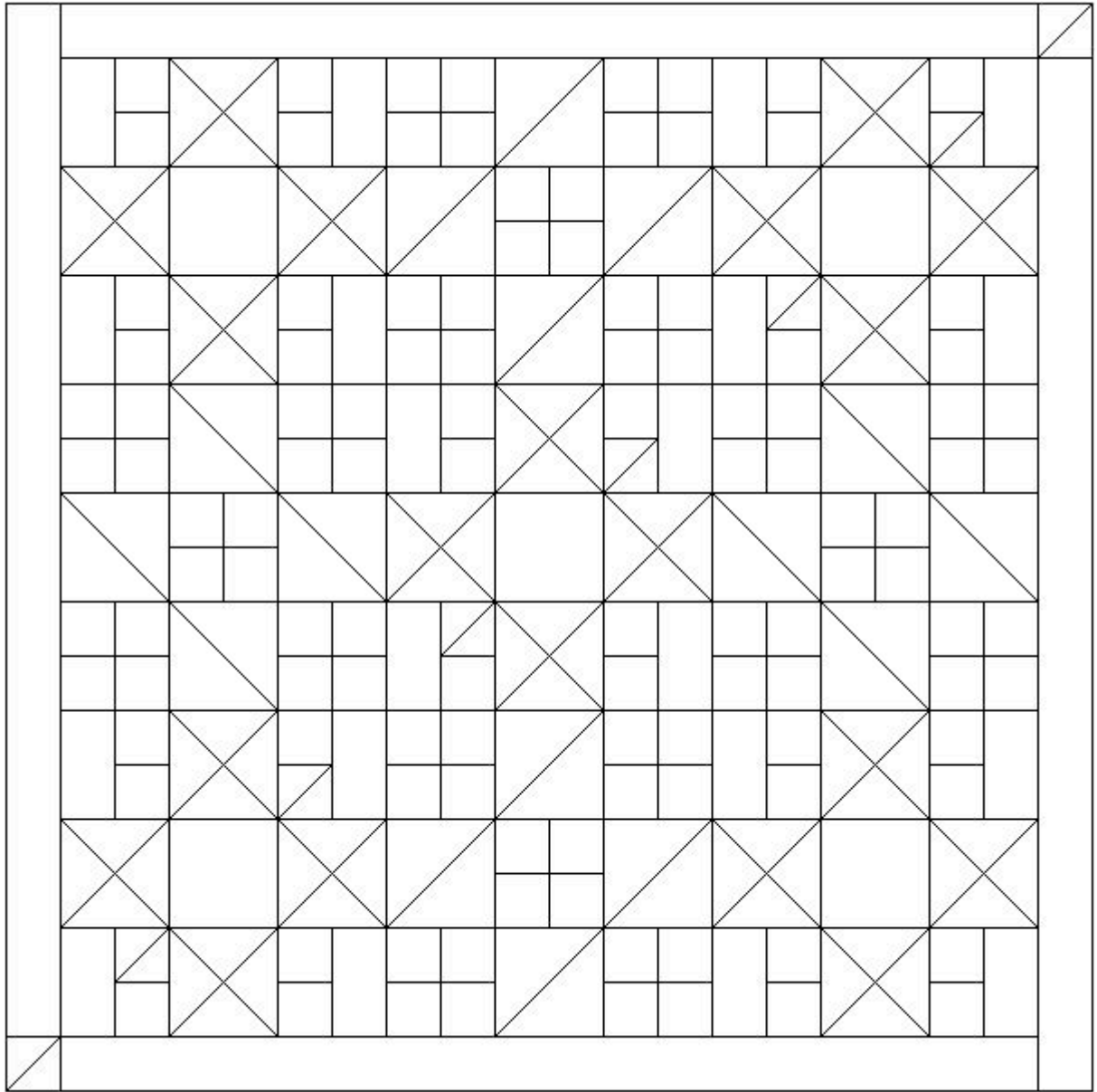
Sew your strips 2" x 27½" to the top and bottom, using Fabric 9 on the top and fabric 10 on the bottom.

Now sew the squares to your side strips. The strip of fabric 10 will have the square at the top and the strip of fabric 9 will have the square at the bottom. Make sure that your squares are facing the correct way matching like colours to like. Sew the remaining pieces to either side.

Sandwich together the top layer, wadding and backing.

Quilt by machine or hand.

Make up some binding using the remaining pieces of fabrics 9 and 10 and attach this to the quilt to complete.



Main diagram

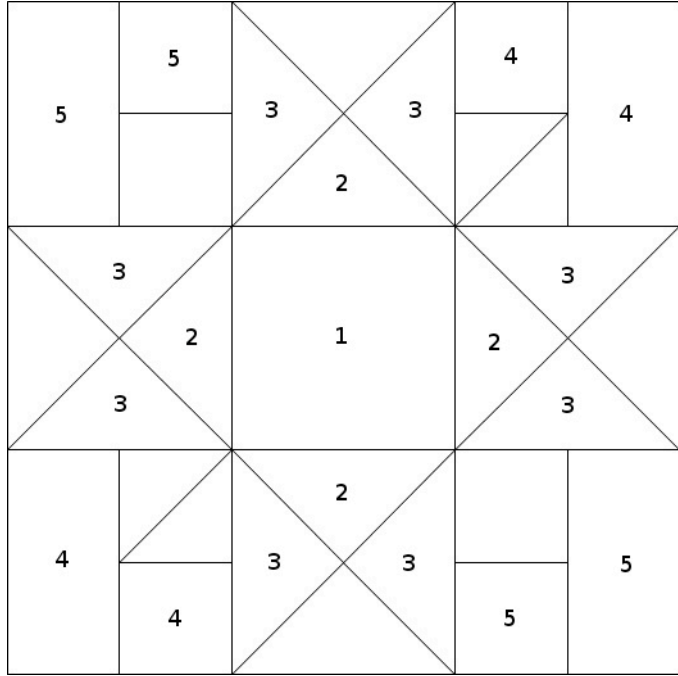

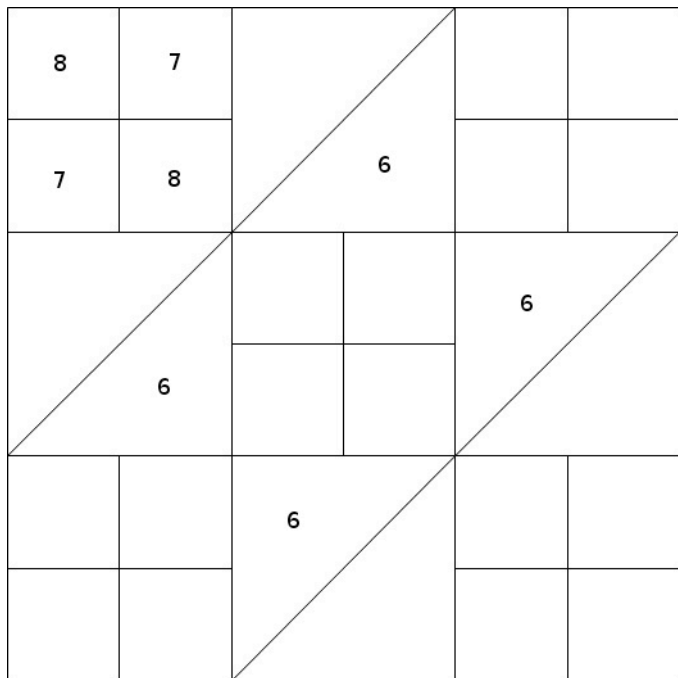
