



## ***Pansybright***

Size 48" x 48"

Fabrics in this quilt are from Pansybright by Fabric Freedom

### **Materials**

| 4. Blue pansies on white F558 col.6 | - | 5/8yd (50cm) |
| 5. Blue tonal pansies F559 col.8    | - | 3/8yd (40cm) |
| 6. Small blue pansies F560 col.5    | - | 3/8yd (40cm) |
| 7. Cream Perfect Palette H50 col.20 | - | fat 1/4      |
| 8. Blue Perfect Palette H50 col.28  | - | 1yd (1m)     |
- Wadding and backing 52" x 52"  
Template plastic

### **Cutting**

A 1/4" seam allowance has been included in all cutting instructions.  
This quilt has a lot of triangles and other bias edges, in order to keep these edges firm you may wish to apply a light spray starch before you begin to cut.

Template – In the centre of a piece of paper draw a rectangle 8" x 4", mark the centre point all sides. Draw a line from centre sides to centre top and bottom to form a diamond. Now add 1/4" seam allowance all around the diamond. Trace this outline onto the template plastic and cut out.

From fabric 1 cut -

8 x 3 3/8" x 12 1/2" strips - cut a 45° off the two short edges to give a long bottom edge and a short top edge.

4 x 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" squares

- From fabric 2 cut -  
 4 x  $6\frac{1}{8}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{8}$ " squares  
 8 from template 1
- From fabric 3 cut -  
 9 x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares  
 4 x  $6\frac{1}{8}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{8}$ " squares
- From fabric 4 cut -  
 8 x  $3\frac{3}{8}$ " x  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " strips - cut a  $45^\circ$  off the two short edges to give a long bottom edge and a short top edge.  
 8 from template 1  
 2 x  $4\frac{7}{8}$ " x  $4\frac{7}{8}$ " squares cut in half diagonally once  
 4 x  $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $5\frac{1}{4}$ " squares cut in half diagonally twice
- From fabric 5 cut -  
 5 x  $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $5\frac{1}{4}$ " squares cut in half diagonally twice  
 32 x  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares
- From fabric 6 cut -  
 4 from template 1  
 8 x  $4\frac{7}{8}$ " x  $4\frac{7}{8}$ " squares cut in half diagonally once
- From fabric 7 cut -  
 32 x  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " x  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " squares cut in half diagonally once
- From fabric 8 cut -  
 12 x  $4\frac{7}{8}$ " x  $4\frac{7}{8}$ " squares cut in half diagonally once  
 40 x  $2\frac{5}{8}$ " x  $5\frac{1}{4}$ " strips cut diagonally from bottom left to top right  
 40 x  $2\frac{5}{8}$ " x  $5\frac{1}{4}$ " strips cut diagonally from top left to bottom right

## **Sewing**

There are eight each of the three block designs in this quilt. Please remember to press each seam as you sew.

### **Block 1**

There are four of each colourway.

1. Lay out all of the pieces for each colourway, take the centre square and sew the long side of the small triangles to opposite sides of the square. This will create a larger square.
2. Now take the larger triangle and repeat as before. Do this for all the blocks.

### **Block 2**

1. Refer to the main picture for the colour sequence and lay out all of the pieces for the eight blocks.
2. Sew the four pieces in each block together, working from top left to bottom right. Repeat for each block.

### **Block 3**

There are four blocks with fabric 2 as the centre square and four with fabric 3.

1. Begin by sewing two small triangles to adjacent sides of the small squares to make four large triangles.
2. Sew these triangles to opposite sides of the centre square to complete the block. Make four blocks for each colourway.

Referring to the main picture for guidance lay out all of the blocks for each row and sew together. Then sew the rows together to complete the quilt centre.

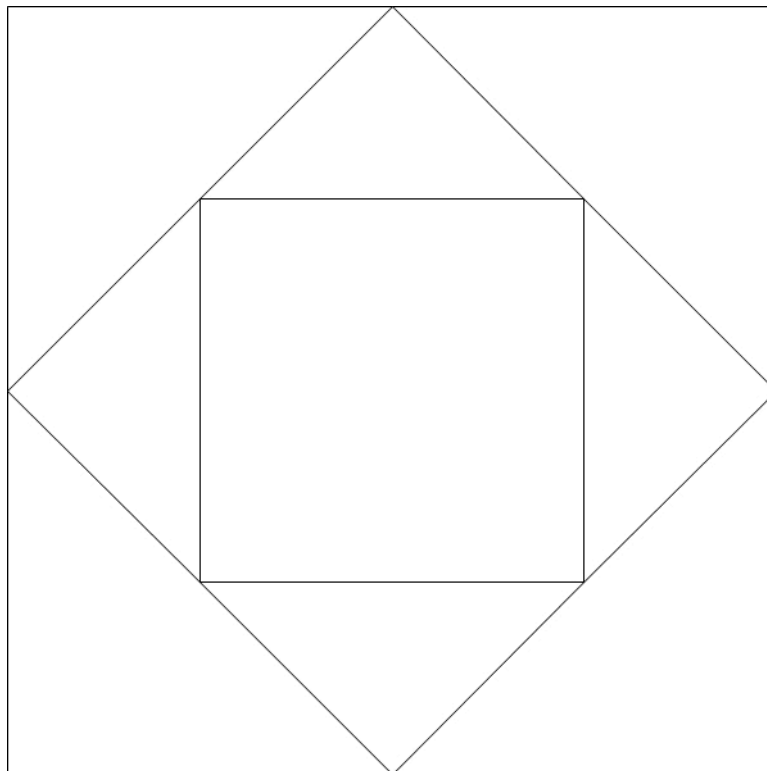
### Border

The border is made up as follows.

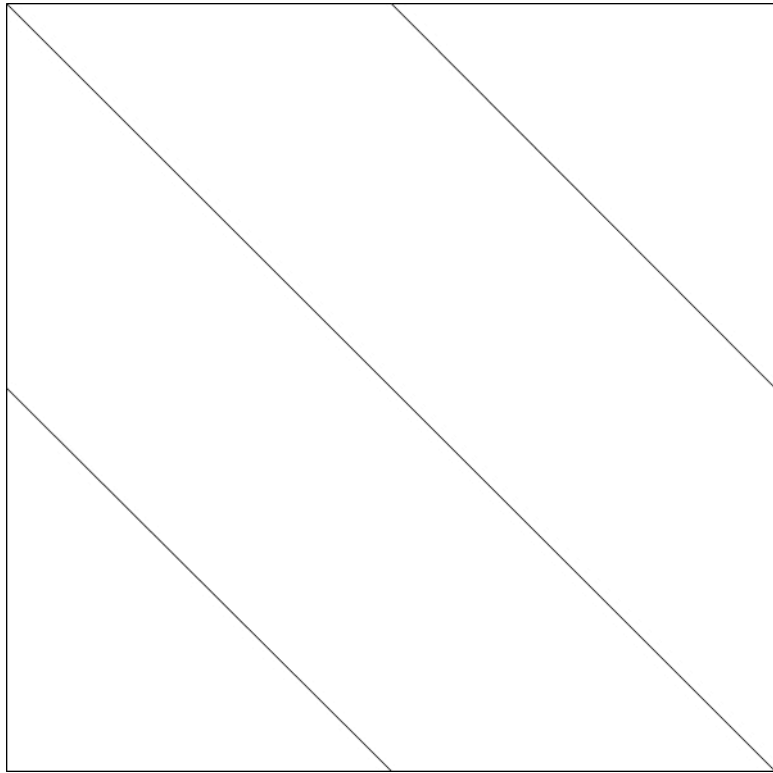
1. Take a diamond shaped piece and sew the longest side of the triangle to opposite sides of the diamond to create a rectangle, as shown on diagram. Make another nineteen.
2. Sew the rectangles together short edge to short edge in four groups of five to make the border strips.
3. Sew a strip to each side of the quilt centre.
4. Add a corner square to each end of the remaining two strips and sew them to the top and bottom of the quilt.

### Quilting and Binding

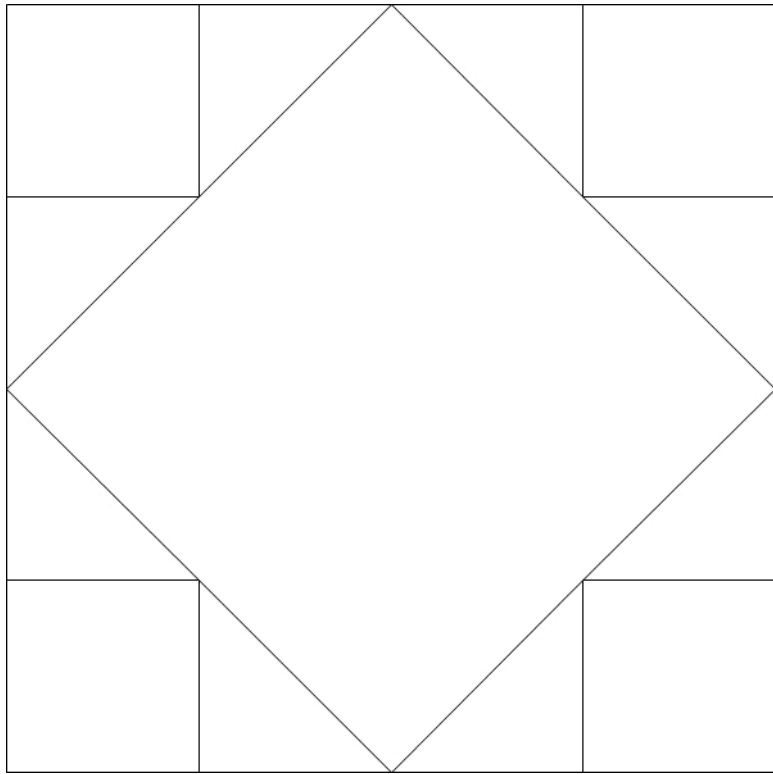
1. Layer together the backing fabric, wadding and quilt top and pin or baste together.
2. Quilt by hand or machine.
3. Using fabric 8 make up a strip long enough to fit around the quilt with an overlap.
4. Add the binding to the quilt.



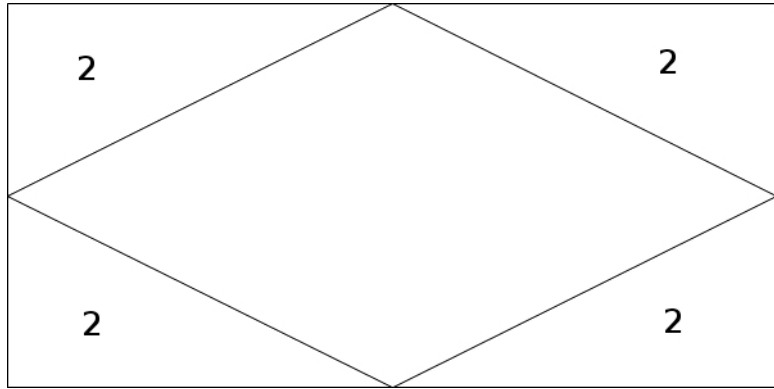
