Size 41" x 54"

All fabrics are from the Victoria range by Fabric Freedom

Requirements.

Cut one fat 1/8 from each fabric as follows.

- Fabric 1. - Stylised floral on dark pink ground F427 col.2
- Fabric 2. - Growing flowers in pink F428 col.2
- Fabric 3. - Dark pink patterned leaves F429 col.3
- Fabric 4. - Stylised floral on light pink ground F427 col.4
- Fabric 5. - Light pink patterned leaves F429 col.2
- Fabric 6. - Bright pink buds F431 col.6
- Fabric 7. - Light pink trailing leaves F430 col.1
- Fabric 8. - Pink buds on black ground F431 col.5
- Fabric 9. - Dark pink trailing leaves on black F430 col.3
- Fabric 10. - Pink growing flowers on black F428 col.3
- Fabric 11. - Stylised floral on black F427 col.3
- Fabric 12. - Light pink and violet buds F431 col.4
- Fabric 13. - Pink trailing leaves on violet F430 col.6
- Fabric 14. - Violet patterned leaves on light pink F429 col.4
- Fabric 15. - Violet growing flowers on purple F428 col.1
- Fabric 16. - Violet buds F431 col.1
- Fabric 17. - Violet patterned leaves on violet F429 col.1
- Fabric 18. - Stylised floral on violet F427 col.1
- Fabric 19. - Glass from Perfect Palette H50 col.39 1.20cm (1¼" yards)

Wadding and backing 45" x 58" (soft & natural)

Threads. Aurifil mako

3852 reat. red/blue/white.

4669 reat. Blues.

Cutting.

From fabrics 1 to 18 cut.

3 x 5½" x 5½" squares, cut in half diagonally once.

5 x 1½" x 3½" rectangles.

From fabric 19 cut.

108 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" squares, cut in half diagonally once.

Making up.

Please read through all the instructions before you begin.

First make up the 'flying geese'. Do this by adding a small triangle of fabric 19 to each side of a

larger coloured triangle, taken from each of the fabrics 1 to 18. Join the long side of fabric 19 to the short sides of the coloured fabric and press each seam as you go.
You should now have 108 'Flying Geese' in total.

Carefully lay out the 'Flying Geese' in strips, starting with fabric 1 at the top of the strips and fabric 18 at the bottom.

Do this for all six strips. In the order you have placed them, sew the geese down in strips and press as you go.

You will now have 6 strips of flying geese in total.

Next make the sashing. Lay out the 1½" x 3½" pieces in the following order, matching short end to short end. Start with fabric numbers,

7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1, 11, 10, 9, 8, 18, 17, 16, 15, 14, 13, 12.

Sew the strips together and press as you go.

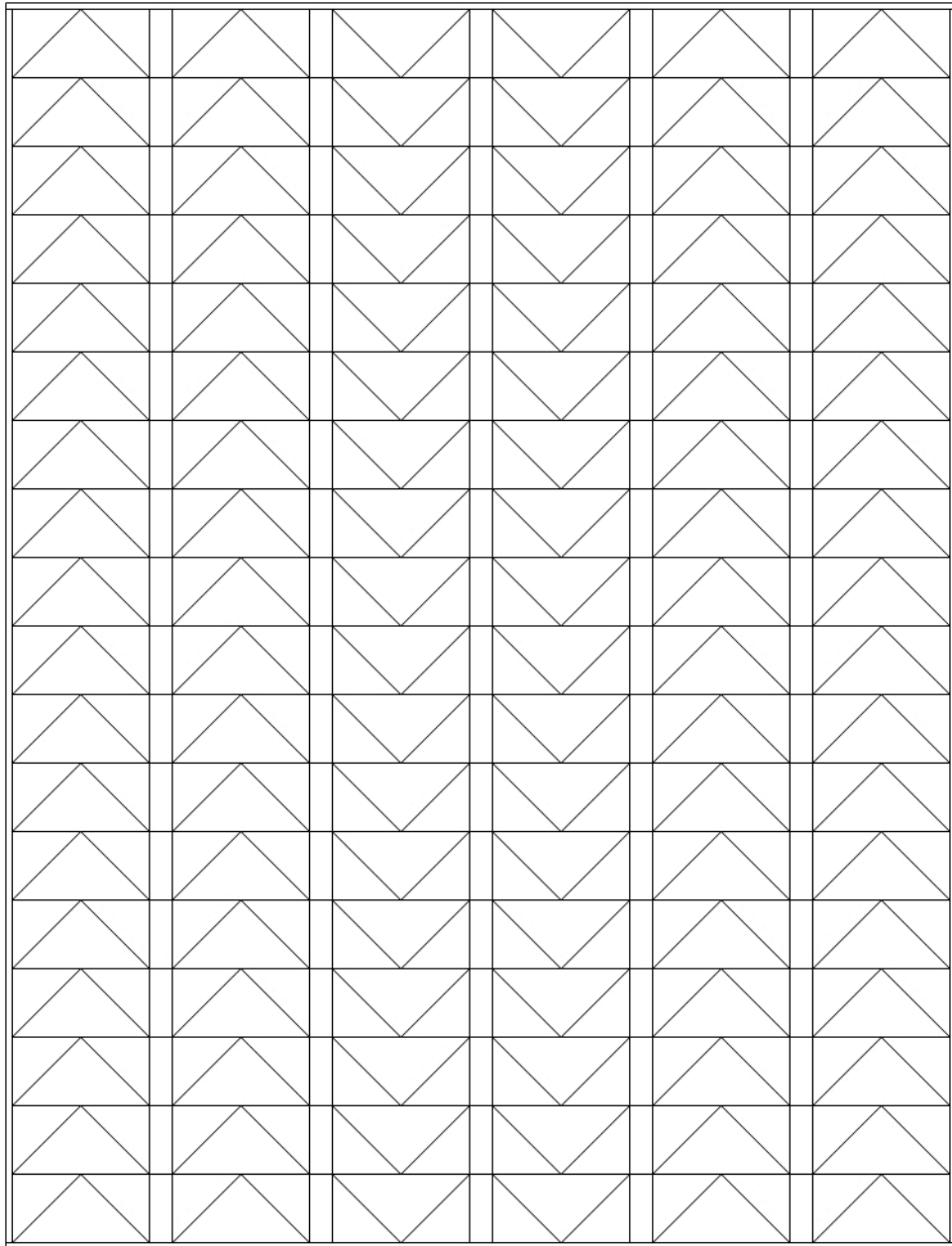
You will have 5 strips in total.

Now lay out the strips of flying geese with the sashing between each row and take care to reverse the two centre strips of flying geese and the centre row of sashing, as shown in the main diagram. Sew together working from left to right and press as you go. The sequence across the top of the piece should be fabrics 1 – 7 – 1 – 7 – 18 – 12 – 18 – 7 – 1 – 7 – 1.

This will complete the top of the quilt.

Sandwich together the quilt top, wadding and backing .
Quilt by hand or sewing machine.

Add a multi-coloured single binding using the remaining pieces of fabric.
